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
CAREER DEVELOPMENT/PROMOTIONAL PROCESS

The Employee Development Guide (EDG) is part of the career development/promotional process for all positions and ranks. The purpose of the process is to:

- Create Clear Expectations for Positions
- Provide a Path for Career Advancement
- · Raise the Minimum Standard
- Support Member Growth

The system also serves to improve employee performance through standardization of competencies and provisions for skill reinforcement and continuous learning.

The Employee Development Guide is the final step in the process and serves to ensure continued growth toward mastery of minimum competencies through consistent application and accountability.

The Employee Development Guide for Firefighter EMT and/or Paramedic lists suggested educational topics that will help the candidate during the preparing for paramedic school, paramedic training and internship, or the accreditation process.
